Lifetime Achievement Awardees

Guru Vinitha Subramanian

Guru Smt. Vinitha Subramanian began her dancing career at the tender age of



four under the tutelage of Thirukoshtiyur Nagarathna Ammal. She then went on to be trained in the Thirukoshtiyur and Pandanainallur styles under Shri Radhakrishnan of Bangalore and Madurai S. Jayaraman, She also received a year of Kathakali training under Shri Manoharan,

She has given performances in diverse cities as Ahmedabad, Calcutta, Tirupati, and all over Tamilnadu. After moving to Texas, she founded Natyalaya School of Dance in 1982. Since then, she has taken scores of students through margam training, culminating in their arangetrams. Many of her students have gone on to make their own marks in the field of dance. She also has several dance dramas to her credit: "Agasthya," "Prahala Bhakthi Vijayam," "Nauka Charitram," "Two faces of Shiva," "Aaru Padai Veedu," "Raja Rajeshwari," "Ganga — A River's story," and "Navahavarna — Colors of Number Nine." She has also won several awards, most recently the 2019 Austin Tamil Sangam Kalai Magudam Award, the 2019 Sambhrama Puraskara Award and the 2019 Agni Foundation Distinguished Artist Hall of Fame honor. Under her direction Natyalaya has grown to over 150 students with branches in North Austin, Round Rock, Leander, and East Austin.

Guru Sujatha Vinjamuri

Sujata Vinjamuri has brought to St.Louis the timeless art Kuchipudi in no small



or compromising manner. A dancer of depth and intellect, Sujata's unique artistry combines elements of aesthetics, devotion and mysticism. Since a tender age, Sujata has been studying the very different styles under the tutelage of many distinguished gurus. She

started Kuchipudi with Ms. Sumathi Kaushal, and later perfected her styles under the personal tutelage of Dr. Vempati Chinna Satyam. Sujata also studied Kathak and Bharatanatyam under the guidance of Guru Gopal Rao and Ms. Uma Rama Rao. She holds a Masters from Osmania University and is currently teaching the Indian dance to over 40 students in her well-established school Kuchipudi Art Academy of Dance St. Louis. Sujata has conceived and produced various themes like Bhagavad Gita, Om Shanti, and Kundalini. She has received high critical acclaim for her performance in her thought-provoking productions, both in USA and India. She has produced a documentary film "The temple and the Swan" a comparison of Kuchipudi and western Ballet dance, which was well received and appreciated by both the western and Indian audience.

Friday Shows

Kathak Performance by Maithili Patel



Maithili Patel is a Kathak artist and choreographer from New Jersey dedicated to telling stories that celebrate and challenge traditional narratives. Kathak, a storytelling art form, has enabled her to create meaningful experiences for diverse audiences. She continues to explore and expand her movement vocabulary to express contemporary themes, while always striving to honor her roots. Under the mentorship of Guru Dr. Pali Chandra, Maithili has been fortunate to share her work globally, performing at events such as The Dubai Kathak Festival, The London Parliament House of Lords, and The Modhera Dance Festi-

val. An avid storyteller, her piece *Draupadi*, choreographed by Dr. Chandra, received acclaim at the New York Kathak Festival 2019; her choreographic debut of *Dark Inside* in New York explored the intersection of internal experience and external reality in mental illness; while her dance film, *Rise*, addressing domestic abuse, resonated deeply at the Swiss International Kathak Festival 2020. Through her art, she remains committed to encouraging dialogue, cultural understanding, and unveiling the intricacies of the human experience.

Aatman

This year marks the 10th anniversary of *Maithili's* solo debut, *Aatman*, first performed in Dubai. A journey that began as an exploration of her identity and

spirit through her connection to dance now returns, refined by a decade of life, experience, and growth.

Revisiting the original choreographies of Maithili's Guru and the concepts behind *Aatman* has allowed her to reflect on the evolution of her artistry and creative process. Her connection to the characters and their stories has deepened, shaped by the shifting lens of time and lived experience. As part of this reflection, **Maithili** will perform excerpts from Jayadeva's *Geeta Govind*—a piece that she first approached at 18 and now returns to at 28. The years in between have transformed her understanding of these verses, allowing her to embody their emotional and spiritual complexity in new ways. In this performance, **Maithili** will share excerpts from *Aatman*, re-embodied—an offering of movement and memory.

Bharathanatyam by Sumangala Varun

Vidushi Sumangala has trained for several years in Carnatic music and Bha-



ratanatyam. She had her initial training in Bharatanatyam at Kerala Kalalayam, Tripunithura, which was founded by the legendary dancer couple Kalamandalam Krishnan Nair and Kalamandalam Kalyanikutty Amma. Today she presents

Mallari - A mallari is a composition associated with the nadaswaram tradition. It is an introductory dance in Bharatanatyam to accompany the utsava murthys in processions. This mallari is in Gambheera naattai raga and chathurasra jathi eka talam. It concludes with a prayer to Lord Ganesha, the remover of obstacles. It is choreographed by Guru Smt. Sheela Chandrashekhar.

Shabdam - A shabdam is a nrithya composition with lyrics interspersed with jathis, composed by Thanjavur Arunachalam Pillai in praise of Lord Nataraja of Chidambaram. The nayika is lovelorn (virahotkhanditha) and is overcome with love for her Lord Nataraja. Set to ragamalika and misra chapu talam, this shabdam is choreographed by the late Guru B. Bhanumathi.

Vachana - Vachanas are brief lines of poetry composed by Shri Basaveshwara and other leaders of the Sharana movement in Karnataka, during the 11th century. Ably choreographed by Guru Smt. Sheela Chandrashekhar, this vachana expands on some popular stories including Ravana using a vein from his arm as a string for his veena, Brahma losing his fifth head for lying, and



the pure devotion of hunter Bedara Kannappa.

Mohiniyattam dance by Sreevidhya Vijayan

Sreevidhya V is an accomplished dancer, educator, choreographer, and performer with a deep-rooted foundation in Bharatanatyam, which she began studying at the age of four. Her artistic journey expanded into advanced training in Mohiniyattam and Kuchipudi under the guidance of esteemed men-

tors.

Mohiniyattam is a classical dance form from Kerala, India, known for its graceful, flowing movements and expressive storytelling. The name combines "Mohini," referring to the enchantress avatar of the Hindu god Vishnu, and "attam," meaning dance, thus translating to "dance of the enchantress.

Chandanam

Chandanam, a revived Mohiniyattam Desi choreography by Guru Nirmala Paniker, unfolds the legend of sandalwood's healing power. The dance begins with the Palazhimadhanam (churning of the milky ocean), where the poison Kalakoota emerges. As Shiva consumes it, the world trembles. The intensity of the burning poison and Kali's fierce manifestation as Parvathi fights to save



Shiva. The transformation occurs as she takes cooling sandalwood paste (Chandanam) from Vishnu's chest and anoints Shiva, restoring balance and harmony. This composition is in Saurashtra Ragam and Aiyadi Thalam.

Bharathanatyam by Sudha Raghuram

Sudha Raghuram is the artistic director of Shivalaya School of Dance based in Montgomery. She is the board member of the Alabama Dance Council and has received several grants from the Alabama State Council on the Arts. In 2019, she received the Alabama Folk Heritage Award. She and her students participate in several multicultural events throughout the year. To Sudha, dance is a powerful way to enrich the experience, educate, engage the audience, and celebrate diversity.

Sudha's dance starts with Pushpanjali (offering of flowers) and continues with a Hindu devotional hymn in praise of Hanuman (Chalisa). It is an Avadhi language text written by Shri Thulasidas.

She concludes the dance with a Telugu song composed by Shri Annamacharya, Brahmamokate. The lines convey the truth that the universe is unified and there exists a supreme consciousness. It celebrates the unity of all existence.

Kuchipudi Dances by Kuchipudi Arts Academy

Kuchipudi Arts Academy of Saint Louis is led by Guru Sujata Vinjamuri. Her students Dhanasri Kavuri, Keerthana Maddineni, Tejaswi Kavuri, Susnigdha Rayana, and Shivani Balaji will perform the following dances.

The Kuchipudi recital begins with Aananda Nartanam, a vibrant piece composed and choreographed by Uma Maheshwar Garu. Celebrating Lord Vinayaka, the remover of obstacles and symbol of wisdom.

The performance then transitions into Ramayana Shabdam, choreographed

by the legendary Vempati Chinna Satyam Garu. This piece honors Lord Rama, depicting key moments from the epic Ramayana and showcasing his valor, compassion, and devotion to dharma. With dynamic storytelling and emotive expression, the dance brings to life Rama's noble virtues. Together, these pieces offer a rich journey through the divine energies of Vinayaka and the heroic ideals of Rama, reflecting the spiritual depth and elegance of Kuchipudi.

About the Choreographer

Guru Prasanna Kasthuri—reverently known as *Guruji*—is a distinguished choreographer, composer, educator, and performer of Indian classical arts. With a profound mastery of *Bharathanatyam* and *Kathak*, India's two foremost classical dance traditions, he has spent over four decades shaping the landscape of dance across India, Europe, and the United States.

As the founder of *Soorya Performing Arts* in St. Louis, Missouri, Guruji has been a tireless advocate for preserving and promoting Indian classical music, dance, and theater in the American Midwest. Under his visionary leadership, Soorya has staged over 50 acclaimed productions, including *Samarpan*, *Defeat of Death*, *Rainbow-2*, *Gokula Nirgamana*, *Anubhava Mantapa*, and more.

Among his many honors are the **Karnataka Kalashri Award** from the Karnataka Sangeetha Nritya Academy (2024), **Missouri Traditional Artist Fellowship** (2024), **Ravi Datar Award** (2020), and several honorary titles such as *Natya Shankara*, *Nritya Bharatha*, *Nritya Bhushana*, and *Kalayogi*.

The Story of Ayyappa – The Divine Warrior of Dharma

This dance drama portrays the sacred legend of Lord Ayyappa, the revered deity of southern India, known for his divine origin and unwavering dedication to dharma (righteousness). Ayyappa—also called *Hariharaputra*—is born of a mystical union between Lord Shiva and Lord Vishnu, who assumes his only female form, Mohini. This union signifies the synthesis of supreme cosmic energies.

Synopsis of the Performance

The drama opens with a divine invocation to Lord Ganesha, remover of all obstacles. The story then unfolds with the rise of the demoness *Mahishi*, who seeks revenge for her brother Mahishasura's death, bringing turmoil to the world. Desperate, the celestial beings turn to Vishnu and Shiva for salvation. In a divine *tandava*, Shiva and Mohini bring forth a radiant child—destined to vanquish evil.

The infant is discovered by the King of Pandalam during a forest expedition and adopted with joy. Named *Manikanta*, he grows into a wise and valiant prince, outshining all, including the Queen's biological son born later. Consumed by envy and manipulation from her advisors, the Queen feigns illness and demands tiger's milk as her only cure—hoping to send Manikanta to his death.

Bravely accepting the task, Manikanta ventures into the forest. There, he confronts and defeats Mahishi in a powerful battle. As Mahishi is vanquished, she is transformed into a celestial maiden who seeks his hand in marriage. Manikanta declines, vowing to remain celibate until no devotees visit his shrine.


The Gods, moved by his valor, offer him blessings. He requests that they appear as tigers and accompany him back—fulfilling the Queen's demand for tiger's milk. Upon his return, the Queen is overwhelmed with guilt and seeks forgiveness. Manikanta, in his compassion, renounces the throne in favor of his brother and chooses a life of spiritual solitude in the forests of *Sabarimala*.

Along the way, he performs miracles—restoring the sight of his Guru's blind son—and ultimately attains divinity. His devotees revere him to this day, singing the sacred hymn "Harivarasanam", which echoes through the hills of Sabarimala.

Tara Priyadarshini Bikkasani is a professional Bharatanatyam dancer. She mastered her intricacies of Bharatanatyam under the tutelage of Nrithya Choodamani Smt. Krishnaveni Lakshnam of Kalakshetra ,Prof. M. R. Krishnamurthy Smt. Uma Sundaram, and Smt. Uma Rao of Kalakshetra, Chennai, India. Tara also had the privilege of learning Abhinayam from Padma Shri. Dr. Nataraja Ramakrishna and Smt. Saride Manikyamma who is a legendary exponent of "Temple Dance form" from Hyderabad, India.

Tara has garnered the attention of media and connoisseurs of the arts by virtue of several hundreds of performances in India and abroad. The schedule she keeps is a testimony of her outstanding calibre and total commitment to her chosen field. Tara has choreographed Ramayana, Krishnam Vande Jagat Guru, Dhasavatharam, Draupadi, and recently Nrithya-Milana, an amalgamation of various Indian classical forms together. FUSED—a fusion of Indian and Western Dances by Samanvita Kasthuri

Samanvita Kasthuri is an emerging fusion choreographer, trained in the styles of Bharatanatyam and Kathak under Guru Prasanna Kasthuri, and Carnatic mu-



sic under Guru Seema Kasthuri. She has received additional training from Guru Lalitha Srinivasan. She attained a dance minor at Saint Louis University. She continued her training in Contemporary as a Teaching and Company Artist for Pack Dance Company this past season, creating an extended version of her first professional, commissioned work, "Krtghna", initially made in 2022 for the Saint Louis University Literary Arts Award Ceremony. Her work mixes Contemporary, Hip-Hop, Bharatanatyam,

and Kathak, focusing on storytelling, expressions, and connecting with your innermost feelings.

Samanvita has presented her work at many venues, such as the Battery Park Festival (New York) in 2022, Waxworks Showcase in (New York) in 2023, Space


Station Dance Residency (St. Louis) in 2023, St. Louis Contemporary Dance Festival in 2023, Los Angeles Indian Dance Festival in 2024, Breaking Ground Festival (Tempe, AZ) in 2025, Disruption (St. Louis), and many more. Samanvita will pursue her career further at Sarah Lawrence College in Bronxville, NY, for a Master's in Fine Arts in Dance for the upcoming year.

Samanvita will present a variety of fusion performances at this year's Festival, including a solo inspired by "Dancing Circles" by Sampha; a collaborative piece with Kyla Kikkawa, a movement artist specializing in a street dance style called "Krump", which plays with Nattuvangam and explores the idea of being a fusion dancer; and a presentation of "Krtghna," performed with Kaylee Arnold, Izzy Perry, and Erin Berson.

"Krtghna" follows the story of Mother Earth, who wakes up in the universe, wonder-struck at the largeness of existence. She stumbles upon a child, who grows up to be Mankind. She gathers the five elements to help mankind breathe and flourish as part of the universe. However, Mankind selfishly exploits the five elements, deteriorating Mother Earth's natural resources. Heartbroken and angry, Mother Earth is left with no choice but to burn up the world. This piece explores the ungratefulness we have exhibited to the Earth, as well as the notion of motherhood and the sacrifices that can come with it.

Anu Samrat - Aikyam

Anu Samrat, founder of Alapadma Dance School in Seattle, presents "Aikyam", which means "merging".



"Aikyam" is a kaleidoscope of movement and mood, as portrayed in all eight styles of Indian classical dances: Bharatanatyam, Kathak, Kathakali, Kuchipudi, Manipuri, Mohiniyattam, Odissi, and Sattriya. The recital will highlight the two main aspects of Indian classical dance: Nritta (movement) and Abhinaya

(expression).

Śhatakatraya, a trilogy of Sanskrit poetry by King Bhartruhari. This collection explores love, ethics, and detachment through three sets of a hundred verses.

We begin with **Śṛṅgāraśataka**, which celebrates the beauty and complexity of love and romance. Bhartruhari uses rich metaphors to capture the enchantment and challenges of love.

Next, **Nītiśataka** offers guidance on living a virtuous life, emphasizing honesty and integrity. These verses encourage us to act with kindness and courage. Finally, **Vairāgyaśataka** focuses on spiritual liberation through detachment. Bhartruhari's later years were marked by a shift to renunciation, inspiring us to seek self-realization. Medha Srigiri - Pralayapa Payodhijale



Medha Srigiri is a devoted Kuchipudi dancer with 17+ years of training and is currently pursuing a Master's in Kuchipudi, she is known for her nuanced abhinaya and dynamic stage presence. Medha

has performed across the U.S. and India, and her work reflects a deep commitment to preserving and sharing the richness of classical Indian storytelling through dance.

Medha Srigiri presents a powerful Kuchipudi interpretation of *Pralayapa Payodhijale*, the opening *ashtapadi* of the *Gita Govinda*, the 12th-century poetic masterpiece by Jayadeva. This invocatory verse glorifies Krishna's ten incarnations (*Dasavatara*), portraying Him as the supreme divine force who takes on different forms to restore cosmic balance. Through rhythmic footwork, expressive abhinaya, and lyrical storytelling, Medha brings to life the majesty and devotion embedded in each avatar. Rooted in bhakti and classical aesthetics, this piece offers spiritual depth and vibrant visual poetry.

Kathak Vaibhavam - Soorya Kathak School

Aaj Shyam Murali Bajaayi – A memorable dance composition of Lucknow Gharana, presents the divine

scenario of Sri Krishna dancing on the banks of Yamuna River with Gopis. – Raag – Khamaj and Teen Taal

Taraana – a Creative work of Guruji Prasanna Kasthuri, presents pure movements through Tatkars, Tukdas and Parans with a beautiful Tihai. This is in Raag: Tilang and Teen Taal. Co-written and composed by Vidwan Raghunandan Bhat.

Andhra Natyam By Radhanika



Nisha Maguluru, has practiced Andhra Natyam since 1988, she began teaching in the U.S. in 2008 under the guidance of Dr. Ramakrishna and other gurus. She founded Radhanika to formalize Andhra Natyam training, with students earning certifications through Silicon Andhra

University (USA) and SPSR Telugu University (India), continuing the tradition and revival of this ancient art form.

Radhanika's team begins the performance with Kumbhaharathi ritual, performed in accordance with Agama nartanam followed by Andhra Natyam choreography 'Kannayya Janminche', celebrating Lord Krishna's birth. The next performance is choreographed for 'Raghuvamsa', a popular krithi and followed by 'Deva Deva' tarangam.

Kuchipudi Academy (Lalitha Samudrala)

Lalitha Samudrala, founder of Kuchipudi Academy (est. 2015), is a trained classical dancer and vocalist. Starting Bharatanatyam at age 3 and Kuchipudi at 9, she studied under Guru Sujata Vinjamuri of Kuchipudi Arts Academy, later under Guru Ravishankar Vempati, son of the legendary Dr. Vempati Chinna Satyam. She has appeared on major platforms and holds records in the Guinness Book of World Records for large-scale dance events. Lalitha holds a Diploma in Carnatic Vocal and a Master's in Indian Classical Dance. Her Academy promotes Kuchipudi, Carnatic Vocal, and Bollywood dance and has performed widely across the USA.







